<p>Squiggle while you Wiggle</p> <p>£3,000</p>	<p>Children will take part in the Shonette Bason Wood 'Squiggle while you Wiggle' programme. The focus will be on the development of both gross and fine motor skills. They will show increased confidence in their own abilities, which will have a direct impact on their motivation and resilience in the classroom. Their self-esteem will be raised and the children will interact with their peers and collaborate more readily and co-operatively. Their motor skills will be developed and refined which will allow the children to access a whole range of experiences that would have previously been frustrating or difficult. This allows children more experiential learning and opportunities to explore the environment around them.
