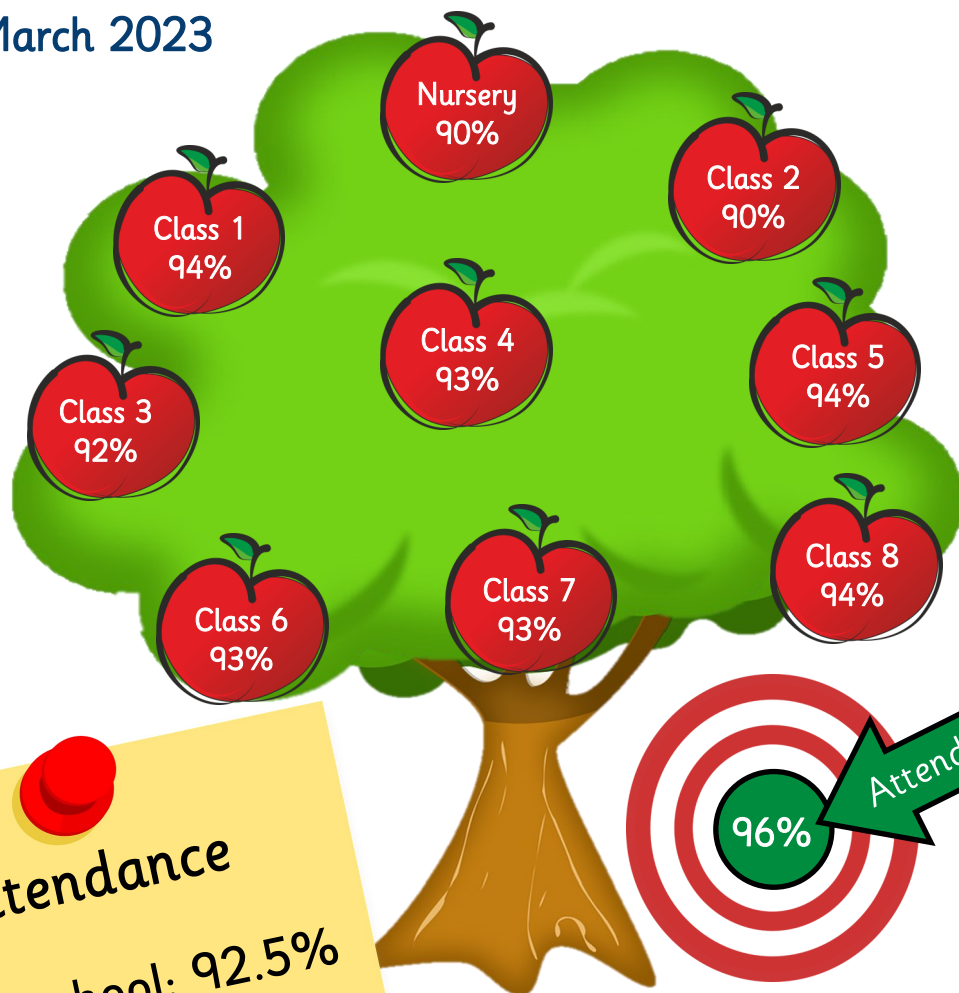


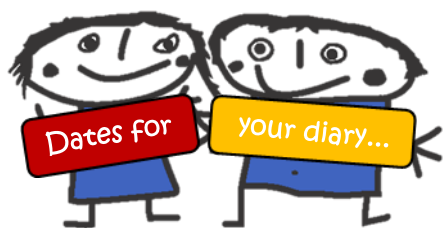
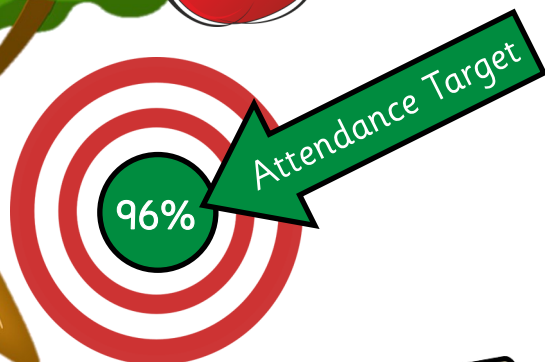

Nursery

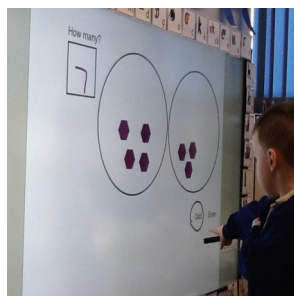
This week in Nursery the children have enjoyed exploring ice in the sensory trays.
